- Discussion around the focus of meetings and information given to trustees being purely on Helen's report and did that give us a wide enough picture of what is happening. Agreed that level of challenge from Trustees needs to be high and minuted.
- Helen asked what the Trustees would like her report to focus
  on agreed that it should mirror the four key areas above and
  also include systems leadership. Tim suggested that there is
  also a focus on celebrating strengths and having these identified
  to share best practice.

### **Head of School Improvement Report** (to follow)

#### **Overview Grid**

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Overview and key shared. Queried attendance data for a couple of schools. Tim pointed out that this document enables Trustees to formulate some challenging questions. Helen talked through some school and showed that whilst in some schools teaching would be a 2 but have been 'ambered' because there are specific things that are going on at school that we are aware of and are working with the schools to improve.

Tim queried what the overall plan was – Helen stated that we wished all of our schools to be good or better.

Kenny asked if all the judgements were based on qualatitive data— Helen and Jackie confirmed that some of them were down to professional judgements based on theirs, ADPs & CEOs knowledge of the school.

Discussed the need for there to be two overviews – one based on the school's annual report and this one based on Trust staff's understanding of the school.

Agreed that areas should be grouped to match the areas on the TOR.

Tim queried the finance section – Helen confirmed that some of it was about amount of money and some about capacity to manage finances.

Kenny pointed out that some of the 'aboves' were not highlighted and the need for 1s to be a different colour from green.

Nursery provision - update (see Helen Tate's report)

Helen to update Overview Grid in line with suggestions.

- Discussed report strengths and next steps. Dursley an area of concern. Fieldcourt very strong provision. Leadership from Fieldcourt to support Dursley.
- Agreed that nursery provision should be added to Overview Grid.

#### **Current assessment information**

Looked at current data

- Kenny questioned about the difference between KSI and KS2 pupil premium; Helen explained that universal free school meals affected the number of pupils that claimed PP in KSI.
- Helen talked about the need for schools to use Target Tracker to assess, not just steps progress, but also to determine what children can/can't do so that gaps in learning can be filled.
